
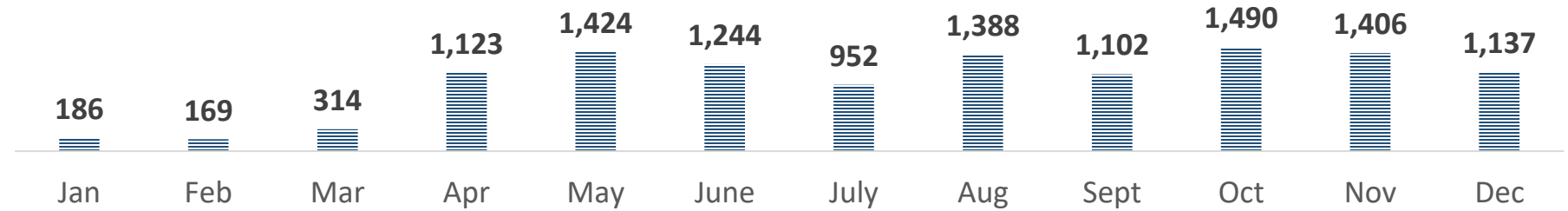




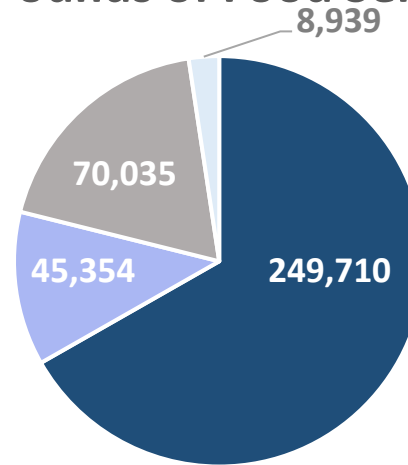
# Community Crisis Center: Year in Review

**374,037** Pounds of Food Served in 2020

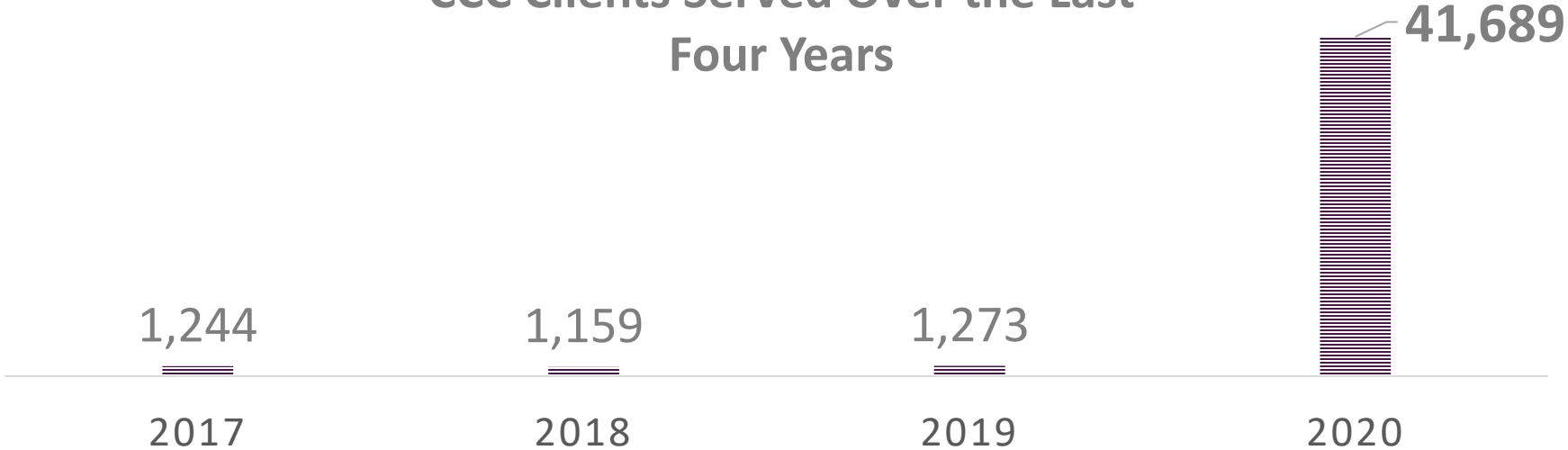

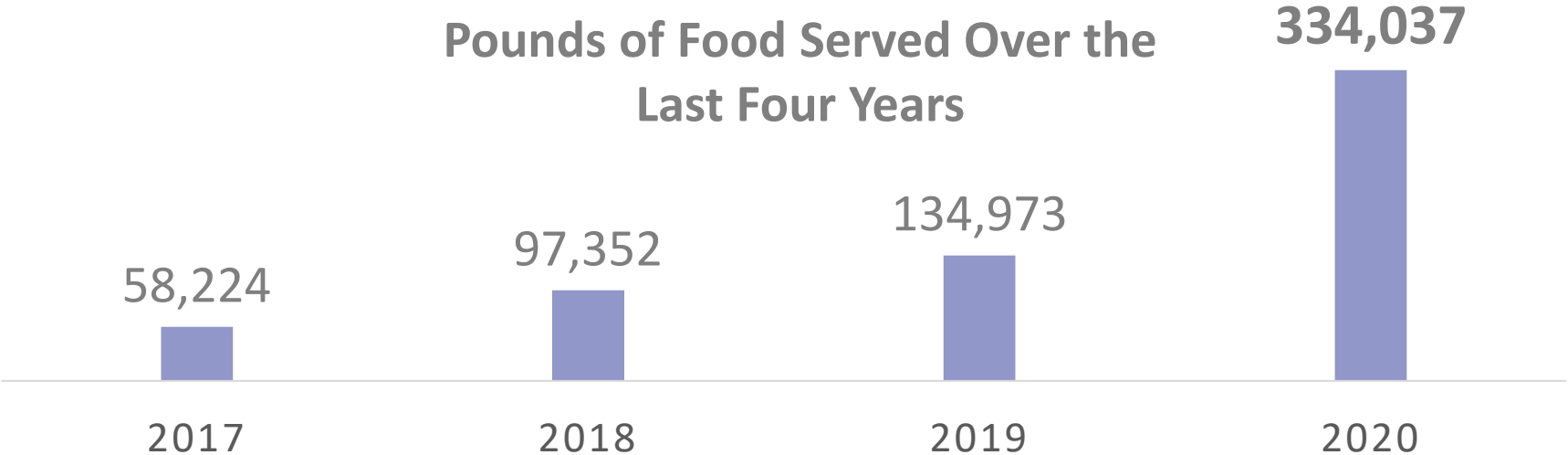
